About the Director

Ms. Aram Bayat, the choreographer and Artistic Director of Khorshid Khanoom Dance Group graduated from the Institute of National and Folkloric Dance in Tehran, Iran and Artistic Photography from Dawson College in Montreal. She continued to study Digital Imaging and Sound at Concordia University. Over 4 decades and through many performances and productions, she has continued to work, develop, and exercise the Art of Dance.

History

The group was founded in 1988 in Montreal by Ms. Aram Bayat as a mean to preserve and present Persian dance to members of the Iranian diaspora. For over 3 decades Khorshid Khanoom has attracted a growing number of students in Montreal garnering much attention through offering numerous performances in collaboration with Canadian and Iranian organizations and introducing this art form to those unfamiliar with the culture. They have performed on various stages in Europe and North America.


